


Within the first two weeks of returning to school, students in my class who wish to try will compete to be the two representatives for the grade 5-8 bee; practice lists will be given to those interested.


- Ski date: Monday, Feb. 26

Generics and substitutions are completely fine. This year, all food must be pre-packaged from the store (no homemade goodies).


Each person on the committee will bring home a paper listing their choices along with






THEME NARRATING THE UNKNOWN

6th grade Math uses Pearson Realize instead of Eureka




Students will use the link on the nine-dot Google waffle to access their math program (along with workbooks) "Easybridge'








